The *Nonviolent Crisis Intervention Program* is a safe, nonharmful behavior management system designed to help human service professionals provide for the best possible care, welfare, safety and security of disruptive, assaultive, and out-of-control individuals. Participants should wear flat, closed-toe, non-skid shoes and proper clothing, so that the participant will be able to do physical exercises. **No partial credit will be given. Both days must be attended in order to receive inservice credit.** Since there is a 20 participant limit, preregistration is required. This in-service is to provide high school teachers with state and local requirements regarding graduation. Teachers will learn the requirements for either graduation path and have an opportunity to ask questions.
